Much of her work highlights the negation or misrepresentation of women in classical texts by adapting these stories through a feminist lens for a contemporary audience. Her most recent projects include additional text for Shakespeare's Much Ado About Nothing at The Stratford Festival and Queen Goneril which premiered at Soulpepper Theatre in rep with King Lear. Her adaptation of Paradise Lost (Stratford Festival), won the Quebec Writers Federation Prize for Playwriting. In 2011, Erin won the Governor General's Award for her play If We Were Birds, which premiered at Tarragon Theatre. Other theatre credits include: Jane Eyre (Citadel Theatre), Piaf/Dietrich (Mirvish Productions/Segal Centre), Beautiful Man (Factory Theatre), The Lady from the Sea (The Shaw Festival), The Millennial Malcontent and Soliciting Temptation (Tarragon Theatre) and Instant (Geordie Theatre). 




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Adam Kostiuk
